

Dear Peter,

Thank you for your email.

As requested, I confirm as follows:

1. The contractual agreement that will replace the MOU is planned to be in perpetuity from the understanding of SANParks unless the Mjejane want to terminate it — the two parties must make it work. During my 13 years with SANParks, all on conservation policy issues, we have not terminated a contractual agreement that was planned to be in perpetuity.
2. The Mjejane have now received government approval for the creation of a permanent low-level water bridge. I have discussed this matter with our CEO, and we fully support the creation of this permanent structure. It will be a permanent structure based on sound engineering that takes consideration of functioning fresh water aquatic systems and for landscape aesthetics.
3. The bridge will afford access into Kruger National Park (KNP) from Mjejane Game Reserve (MGR), and vice versa, on terms and conditions that will be agreed to in the signed contract. **The bridge will be erected ostensibly for this purpose.**
4. There will be consideration of a limited high level investors to have negotiated access over the bridge. We need to be specific and clear by what we mean here. I envisage this consideration as follows:
 - a. By high level investors we mean high cash injection and support for the MGR that contributes substantially to the social upliftment of the Mjejane Trust and its broader community. We must be able to quantify this, and be able to account for such a social contribution.
 - b. By access for these high level investors we mean:
 - i. Ability to arrive in private vehicle through any gate in KNP and be able to cross over into MGR during normal visitor times of KNP, and ability to drive private vehicle over the bridge on the MGR side to exit through any gate of KNP.
 - ii. Ability to drive KNP Approved Game Drive Vehicle over the bridge into KNP and back into MGR with a guide holding a valid KNP appropriate rating from Field Guides Association of South Africa.

Finally, our commitment to the MT and MGR is in terms of holistic management of the environment, our Constitution, NEMA (Protected Areas Act), the Restitution of Land Rights Act, and SANParks commitment to sustainable management of buffer zones associated with its national parks. We want this relationship to work for the benefit of all.
